**Winslow Indian Health Care Center
COVID-19 Mass Vaccine Clinic in Whitecone, Arizona**



WINSLOW, Ariz. — On Thursday, Winslow Indian Health Care Center (WIHCC), in collaboration with Navajo Nation Community Health Representatives, Navajo County Sheriff's Department, Whitecone Chapter House and Whitecone Senior Center, scheduled 48 appointments for the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 Vaccine. WIHCC Public Health Nurses administered a total of 43 Johnson & Johnson vaccine in the arms of Whitecone community members. There are 5,706 WIHCC patients who are partially vaccinated with at least 1 dose; 3,385 WIHCC patients who are fully vaccinated, which brings WIHCC to a grand total of 9,091 vaccine doses given as of today. WIHCC encourages everyone to get vaccinated to get our lives back to normalcy.



*Single dose Johnson & Johnson Vaccine

You can receive the Johnson & Johnson one-shot vaccine if: You have time constraints due to work or caring for others; or if you may have difficulty returning for a second dose due to time or other reasons. The side effects are similar to Moderna and Pfizer vaccines (localized pain at injection site, headache and fatigue). In clinical trials the Johnson & Johnson was more than 85% effective in preventing serious illness and protection against COVID-19 hospitalization and death. Most importantly, serious complications from COVID-19, including deaths, have been almost completely eliminated in patients receiving the vaccine.

WIHCC's Mobile Unit Coordinator, Keanu Frazier, is tirelessly coordinating all Mass Vaccine Clinics. "I would like to extend my gratitude to the Whitecane Chapter House, Whitecane Chapter Senior Center for their efforts in encouraging community members to get vaccinated. I would like to thank WIHCC Staff and all those involved for helping our community members especially in adverse weather conditions. I would like to encourage everyone to get their vaccine when available to them to protect our Dine Culture, our Dine Tradition, our Dine Values and our Dine People," said Keanu Frazier.
